Common Shopping Idioms, Phrases, and Expressions in English



When an article is well below the usual price.

it's a bargain.

That handbag goes beautifully with the dress, and at that price *it's a bargain*!

If you ------ something you don't have enough money to buy it.

I can't afford it.

"I'd love that jacket but I can't afford it!"

If an article or service ------, it is very expensive indeed.

it costs an arm and a leg.

"The diamond engagement ring cost an arm and a leg!"

Something that ------ is very expensive.

it costs a fortune.

"Look at the price of that bag - it costs a fortune!"

The expression ------ means that something is so cheap that it's almost as if you haven't paid anything for it.

it's a steal.

"At that price *it's a steal*. You won't find it cheaper in any other shop."

Something that is ------ is worth the money spent on it.

it's good value for money.

"The quality is excellent so it's good value for money."

The expression ------ means that something is a bit expensive.

it's a bit pricey.

"Their clothes are <u>a bit pricey</u> but they have a wonderful selection"

If you -----, you go shopping for a very long time, until you are exhausted.

shop till you drop

"If you go to London with Ashley, you'll **shop till you drop**, so take comfortable shoes!" The term ------ refers to the idea that buying things can make you feel better.

shopping therapy

"A little <u>shopping therapy</u> can usually cheer up bored teenagers."

When people go -----, they look at things in shop windows, without actually purchasing anything.

window shopping

"I haven't been paid yet, so I can only go <u>window shopping</u>."
