




Sb's eyes are bigger than their stomach

My eyes are always bigger than my stomach when I go to all-you-can-eat buffets.








"You'll never eat all that. Your problem is your eyes are bigger than your stomach."

Be all eyes


To be watching sb/sth carefully and with a lot of interest






We were all eyes as the princess emerged from the car.

An eye for an eye (and a tooth for a tooth)







Have eyes in the back of your head

My teacher seems to have eyes in the back of her head.




Have your nose in the air SYN: look down your nose at sb

• The girl has had her nose in the air since she moved here. She doesn't seem interested in making friends with any of us.





Under sb's nose



I searched everywhere for the letter and it was under my nose all the time.


If sth is under sb's nose, it's very close to them but they cannot see it.








My lips are sealed

• Used to say that you will not repeat sb's secret to the other people.










BE ALL EARS


To be waiting with interest to hear what sb has to say
